POPE FRANCIS VISIT TO PHILADELPHIA IN SEPTEMBER

There are two major events taking place:

1. The World Meeting of Families at the Philadelphia Convention Center - Sept. 22nd to 25th. The Pope does not attend this event but there are well-known speakers and it may be worthwhile for parishioners. Pre-registration is due to Eniola Honsberger, of the Paterson Diocese by June 22. The basic package for adults is \$150 including Congress Registration and Welcome Kit. The basic package for children (ages 6-17) is \$120 which includes Youth Congress registration and Welcome kit. One day for anyone regardless of age is \$95 which includes registration and welcome kit. 2. Pope Francis - Mass on Sun., Sept., 27th. NOTE: There are some logistical issues to be aware of:

- There are no tickets for this Mass
- There are no seats
- There is limited accessibility to the Mass location and a frozen zone within one mile of the location (no parking and only mass transit will be permitted)
- There will be very limited or non-existent food locations or restroom facilities

Parishioners have asked about planning a bus trip. Due to these issues it would not be possible for us to plan a bus trip until we have more information. Final papal plans are due to be discussed in June and at that time we hope to have more details on the trip as a whole.

"HOLY CONVICTION"

In today's Gospel, Jesus asks "do you not yet have faith?" It is easy to have faith and trust in God when all is going well in our lives, but it is in life's storms that our faith and trust are shaken. Today's readings remind us that God loves us beyond all human understanding. When we take Jesus's message deep into our hearts and truly die to self then we become a new creation, living only for Christ, by loving and serving each other. When you understand it is Christ's holiness, not yours, that you are grafted into and it is His righteousness that gains His followers salvation. Then, the gift of faith truly becomes yours. It is this awesome love of Christ that impels us to fight the good fight and to weather every storm. God walks beside you, cries with you, rejoices with you and above all lives in you and loves through you.
