### RETIREMENT

According to Canon Law, a Pastor who reaches the age of 75 must submit his resignation to the Diocesan Bishop. Msgr. Carroll turns 75 on July 28<sup>th</sup>, so therefore he has submitted his resignation. According to a phone conversation, Bishop Serratelli told him he would remain as Pastor for at least another year so that he may celebrate his 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Priestly ordination and his 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary as Pastor of OLM, next May and June. Msgr. Ryan, the founding Pastor, holds the record of 29 years a Pastor. (1962-1991). It is not common these days for Pastors to remain that long in the same parish.

Because of the number of persecuted Christians in the world who are being denied their fundamental rights, Bishop Serratelli has designated the month of August as a diocesan-wide Month of Prayers for Those Suffering Religious Persecution. In an attempt to support this intention, our parish will do the following:

1. Include this petition in the Prayers of the Faithful at all Masses.
2. Offer a votive Mass for the persecuted Christians" as often as possible at daily Masses during August.
3. Devote Eucharistic Adoration & Benediction August 7<sup>th</sup> to persecuted Christians.
4. Pray the rosary on first Saturday, August 1<sup>st</sup> for this intention.
5. Encourage parishioners to pray, sacrifice and perform acts of charity during August for our suffering brothers and sisters.
6. Pray for those suffering religious persecution daily

Good and gracious Father, whose own Beloved Son suffered violence and death for the salvation of the world, Listen graciously to our cry for all who are being persecuted for their faith.

In your great mercy, comfort them with the Holy Spirit. Give them strength in the face of hostility and courage in the face of trial.

Open the eyes of those who raise their hands in violence to see others as their brothers and sisters, children of the one Father of all. By your grace, turn their hearts from hatred to love.

Through the powerful intercessions of the Immaculate Queen of Peace, may justice and peace prevail so that all may have the freedom to worship you, the one true God and Him who you have sent, Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

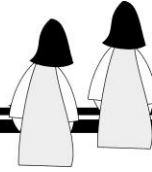

### First Reading: Jeremiah 23:1-6

In this passage, God denounces false leaders who have scattered his people. He promises that they will be reunited and led by one who is just and wise.

### Second Reading: Ephesians 2:13-18

Paul explains that through Jesus Christ, there is no longer hostility between Gentile and Jew. Instead, through the Spirit of Christ, both groups become one body and are equal in the eyes of God.

### Gospel: Mark 6:30-34

The apostles returned after their first mission and told Jesus what they had done and taught. He told them to rest, but the people kept coming to them. So they went to find a private place, but the people learned where they were going and arrived first. Jesus felt sorry for them and decided to teach them instead of resting.

## A CALL TO SERVE

It has been approximately two years since I accepted the call to serve in the Prison Ministry of the Diocese of Paterson. At first, I must admit, I was intrigued by the thought of visiting a jail and meeting women and men who had been incarcerated for God knows what offense. My initial reservation was quickly overcome by the constant flashing in my head of Matthew 25: 34-36, "For when I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me". Nevertheless, I kept asking myself what I could possibly do, how could I possibly help. Really, there was only one way to find out and it was to sign up and pray for the best.

What I experienced was a humanity that had lost its way and was desperate for help. Men and women that grew up in very limiting environments; often with mother and father addicted to alcohol, drugs and whatever they could lay their hands on; with very elementary education and little or no meaningful guidance. Men and women abandoned, as is often the case, by family and friends because of the incarceration who are totally alone in jail, with little hope of a change in their lives. Men and women confined to a large room / cell housing 30 to 40 at a time, devoid of privacy and often worried about their safety. One thing they have in common, they are searching for God but not feeling worthy of the love of God or their fellow human beings.

During our weekly Eucharistic service, I have been able to see how the inmates grasp at the message in the scriptures and our words of love and hope and how appreciative they are for our presence on Sunday. We, the volunteers, are often the only link the inmates have with the outside world, aside from the public defender assigned to their case. We bring the message of God's love to them and offer the hope that has the power to change their lives. And without exaggeration, we, the volunteers, receive more blessings from the inmates than they receive from us.

So, if you are as intrigued as I was and want to take a chance at kindling a little flame of hope that, may eventually become a blaze in the heart of a "lost sheep", give me a call, text message or email, and I will be happy to sit down or talk to you in more detail. It only requires three hours of your time a month but the rewards will last you the entire month.

**Warning, serving Jesus in the prison ministry is addictive!**
