### RETIREMENT

According to Canon Law, a Pastor who reaches the age of 75 must submit his resignation. Msgr. Carroll turns 75 on July 28<sup>th</sup>, so therefore he has submitted his resignation. Bishop Serratelli has told Msgr. he would remain as Pastor for at least another year so that he may celebrate his 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Priestly ordination and his 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary as Pastor of OLM, next May and June. Msgr. Ryan, the founding Pastor, holds the record of 29 years a Pastor. (1962-1991). It is not common these days for Pastors to remain that long in the same parish.

### RELIGIOUS + EDUCATION

The Summer Religious Education Program is in full swing. We are enjoying the close to 300 children that parents have entrusted in our care. The students are learning about Jesus, the Old and New Testaments, sacraments and the commandments among other things. ### MONTH OF PRAYER FOR THOSE SUFFERING RELIGIOUS PERSECUTION

Because of the number of persecuted Christians in the world who are being denied their fundamental rights, Bishop Serratelli has designated the month of August as a diocesan-wide Month of Prayers for Those Suffering Religious Persecution. In an attempt to support this intention, our parish will do the following:

1. Include this petition in the Prayers of the Faithful at all Masses.
2. Offer a votive Mass for the "persecuted Christians" as often as possible at daily Masses during August.
3. Devote Eucharistic Adoration & Benediction August 7<sup>th</sup> to persecuted Christians.
4. Pray the rosary on first Saturday, August 1<sup>st</sup> for this intention.
5. Encourage parishioners to pray, sacrifice and perform acts of charity during August for our suffering brothers and sisters.
6. Pray for those suffering religious persecution daily

## “ONE”

Today's powerful readings remind us that we are one body, one spirit called to one hope, in one faith, in the one Lord Jesus Christ, through one baptism. The first reading and the gospel both speak about the miracle of the multiplication of bread as to feed many and to increase faith in the one God. What will it take to increase your own faith in Christ and His real presence in the Eucharist? The early Christians understood from the very beginning that the true presence of God was being offered to all people through the risen Christ. They understood that the same power that multiplied the fish and loaves, to feed the thousands of hungry people that day, would also be made manifest in the transformation of bread and wine into Christ's true body and blood, at every Mass, in every part of the world, as a fulfillment of Christ's promise to never leave us. This is God's life giving sacrament that feeds and nourishes our soul. Jesus himself tells us "I am the living bread come down from heaven". Have we become smarter than the apostles, the early Christians, the saints and Christ himself? The moment we accept in faith, that Christ is truly present in the Eucharist, we begin to overflow with love, mercy and forgiveness. We begin to understand what it means to be "one" in Christ and with Christ. Christ's death produced an everlasting covenant "The Eucharist" for those who believe so we may become ONE! ## SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### First Reading: II Kings 4:42-44

A man brought twenty loaves of bread to Elisha the prophet, who told his servant to distribute it to the people. The servant asked how he could offer twenty loaves to one hundred people. Elisha replied that God had said, "They shall eat and there shall be some left over." After all the people had eaten, there was bread left over as God had said.

### Second Reading: Ephesians 4:1-6

Paul implores the Ephesians to live a life worthy of their calling by preserving unity among all of Christ's followers. He reminds them that there is one body, one Spirit, and one God who works through all people.

### Gospel: John 6:1-15

Jesus fed a crowd of five thousand people with five loaves of bread and a couple of dried fish. After everyone present had enough to eat, twelve baskets of leftover bread were collected. Jesus then realized the people would want to make him king so he fled alone.

# You Are Invited to a Journey for the Entire Parish

**Journey of conversion for the parish** — Right of Christian Initiation for Adults or RCIA is a journey of conversion for the person participating in the initiation process, and by extension it can be a journey of conversion for the whole parish! That is, conversion happens if the parish fully embraces the process of initiation and walks the journey of faith with the candidates for initiation.

**Discipleship and mission** — RCIA is the Church's way of forming new disciples of Jesus Christ. It's the normative way the Catholic Church welcomes its newest members, but even more important than membership in the Catholic Church is discipleship in Christ Jesus. Through a gradual, complete and comprehensive training in the Christian way of life (*Rite*, no. 75), the un-baptized comes to know Jesus Christ through the Catholic Christian community and they learn to live as Jesus' disciples. Then, as disciples, they continue the mission of Jesus Christ in the world today.

The entire Christian community is responsible for the initiation of its newest disciples. Here are some specific ways:

**As mentoring community.** Every baptized parishioner has a role in initiation of our new members. We are part of that mentoring community that apprentices the new disciples. By observing our prayer, words, deeds and actions in the parish and in the broader community our newest members learn what it means to live as a Catholic Christian today. We provide the examples. We are the models. RCIA depends on us because we make up the Christian community.

**As sponsors.** In addition to the prayers we offer for our candidates and the examples we provide, there are other specific ways parishioners are involved in RCIA. Baptized members of the community serve as sponsors for candidates in the RCIA. A sponsor is an active member of the parish who walks with the candidate on the journey to new, fuller life in Christ. The sponsor supports and guides the candidate along the way. The sponsor is the candidate's personal connection to the parish.

**As catechists, coordinators and assistants.** Members of the community also serve as catechists (teachers) for the process of initiation. Other members of the community serve as coordinators and assistants in various aspects of the initiation process. Furthermore, in *Journey to the Fullness of Life*, the bishops urge that "even more parishioners" become actively involved in the RCIA. The more parishioners become personally invested in the process of initiating others into the life of Christ, the more the community itself will be renewed in its own life in Christ.

**As members of the Sunday assembly.** There is one final way that every worshipping parishioner is involved in the RCIA. That's through participation in the liturgical rites of initiation that usually happen at Sunday Mass, especially in the months before Easter but also throughout the year. There are major liturgical rituals that mark the progress of the candidates who are in the initiation process. These liturgical rites are major events not only for the candidates in the process, but also for the entire parish. During the rites the parish recognizes and celebrates the candidates. As a member of the parish you are asked to pray with and for those in the initiation process. As a member of the Body of Christ, you also make manifest Christ's presence in the community. You, and we, are a sign of Christ to the candidates in the RCIA.
