TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 53:10-11

Isaiah speaks of how the Servant of God will have to give his life up for the sins of other people. Because of this suffering the Servant will receive eternal life for himself and all the people whose sins are forgiven because of him.

Second Reading: Hebrews 4:14-16

Jesus is considered to be the new high priest and mediator between God and his people. Fortunately, Jesus has experienced the same temptations as other people, and so he has more tolerance of our weaknesses.

Gospel: Mark 10:35-45

Two of the disciples ask Jesus that they be allowed to sit at his right and left side when he comes into his glory. Jesus explains that they should not be concerned with their position. Instead they should concern themselves with serving others just as Jesus was planning to serve many in giving his own life for their sins.

2015 Celebrates St. Theresa of Avila's 500th Anniversary. St Theresa taught: "His Majesty knows best what is suitable for us. It is not for us to advise Him as to what He must give us, for He can rightly reply that we know not what we ask for," just as the Apostles did in today's gospel. Can we look at the cross and comprehend Christ's message which is "You who wish to be great must be a slave to all." Slave is a strong word yet Christ chose to use it to make His point. Are you willing to be a slave for Christ? Power comes from humility, service and requires spiritual maturity. In order to become a worthy slave for Christ, we must first be master over our own will and surrender it to Christ's Divine Will. Slaves for Christ possess and live the seven virtues; Sainthood is your goal since we are created for it. St. Paul said, "I have made myself a slave to all, that I might win the more" (1 Cor 9:19).
