Pope Francis will open a Holy Year dedicated to the theme of God's Divine Mercy on Dec. 8th, 2015, which is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It will end one year later on the Solemnity of Jesus Christ the King. Pope Francis has and will continue to speak about the mercy of God, especially during the holy year. Holy years ordinarily occur every fifty years. The last one was in 2000, however, Pope Francis believes that God's mercy is so important for people to understand and appreciate that he has dedicated an entire year as a Holy Year of God's Mercy. Pope Francis invites all Catholics to take advantage of the graces available during a holy year and to seek his forgiveness of our sins especially if it has been a long time since we received it through the Sacrament of Divine Mercy, Reconciliation.

THE PRESENTER: Fr. Ronan Murphy from Dublin is a priest of the Diocese of Camden. Ordained a priest, on May 13th in the Jubilee year 2000, which was the memorial of Our Lady of Fatima, he has served as a parochial vicar in several parishes and has given missions and conferences in many countries. Presently, he is chaplain to a Carmelite Monastery in New York. He has also given retreats for the Marian Movement of Priests.
