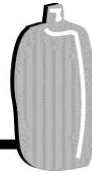

“HEART INVENTORY”

Today’s readings speak to us of charity and self-giving. They present us with two widows. In the first reading, the widow gives all her food to feed the prophet. In the gospel, the widow gives her tiny donation from her poverty. In their self-sacrifice they reveal to us “their truth”, for they trust & love the Lord more than themselves. Their giving flows from their hearts, which belongs to God. They understood that judgment comes, not from how much we give, but rather if our gifts reflect the condition of our hearts. Take an inventory of your own heart; is it filled to capacity with a variety of desires, hostilities, judgments, jealousies, worries and fears? It takes an honest self-reflection to discover that your desires and possessions are consuming you. Your pre-occupations with “getting more” leave little or no room for God. The next prayer that you pray might include “Lord, help me to love you more, help me to empty myself of all except for You.” Then you may find that God has expanded your heart, including your generosity, discovering that “He” is all you really need. THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: I Kings 17:10-16

Elijah asked a widow for a cup of water and a piece of bread. She told him she was almost out of flour, and that she and her son would soon starve. Elijah told her not to be afraid, as God had told him the jar of flour would not go empty. So she did as he had asked and prepared bread from the last of her flour. As God had said, her jar did not go empty, and she and her son had plenty to eat.

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:24-28

The high priests entered the sanctuary each year and offered a sacrifice, but not a sacrifice of their own blood. Just as people die once and are judged, Christ was offered up once for the sins of many.

Gospel: Mark 12:38-44

Jesus expressed disgust over the hypocrisy of some of the scribes for wanting special treatment from the people. He watched the wealthy put large contributions into the collection box, but explained that what they gave was surplus wealth, and not a real sacrifice. He told them the biggest donation was a small amount from a widow, because she had given up the only money that she had to live on.
