In today's Gospel, you are invited to dine at the table of salvation. We accept Jesus' invitation by choosing a humble seat. Your place at the table must include the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind and all those who can do nothing to pay you back for your service. Jesus' parable is a teaching on your spiritual readiness to enter the Kingdom of God. He is challenging you to inspect your every action. What is your motivation behind all that you do? It is the purity of your intention that Christ judges. Do you seek honor, recognition and praise or are you satisfied that you do all for "God's eyes only". Jesus requires you to forgo all reward until the eternal banquet where you will receive the 'resurrection of the righteous", which is far greater than any earthly reward. First Reading: Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29


