“WE”

Today's first reading ties in well with today's gospel. It is a familiar story that exists through all of mankind's history. It is the story of "us and them". The Old Testament prophet, Amos, warns us not to feel comfortable in our mediocrity. Jesus continues this sentiment as He tells the parable of the rich man and the poor man Lazarus, laying at his door suffering. Who is at **YOUR** door suffering? They both die and the rich man, who is now suffering, sees the poor man being cherished in Heaven. His terrible fate rested on his idea that Lazarus was not "one of us". Do you separate people into "us and them"? The next time you listen to the news replace those false boundaries and instead try accepting that "one of us shot the cop, one of us robbed the house, one of us abused the wife or child". You see, we are all in this together; we belong to the human race. What can we do so that "one of us" will not be hungry, homeless, penniless, lonely and loveless? There truly is enough of everything to provide for all of us, we just need the determination, guts and love to get it done. "We the people" must all share God's vision of humanity which excludes "us and them" but includes only "we". Did you ever ask yourself, why is there suffering? Although God does not cause suffering he allows it, because in His wisdom, He knows that compassionate, merciful people are moved beyond themselves by suffering or witnessing suffering. The rich man's heart was not moved, therefore he earned his fate. Are you moved? "We" are God's **Mercy**, active in our world. First Reading: Amos 6:1a, 4-7

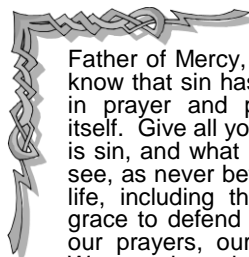
Amos denounces the selfish attitude of those who surround themselves with luxuries with no concern for others. He goes on to warn that because these people lacked interest in the state of their society, they would be the first to be exiled.

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 6:11-16

Paul tells Timothy to seek integrity, faith and love. Paul urges him to attain everlasting life by maintaining strong faith in Jesus and in God until Jesus returns.

Gospel: Luke 16:19-31

Jesus tells of a rich man who feasted daily, while a beggar named Lazarus went hungry outside his gates. When both men died, Lazarus was taken to Abraham, but the rich man was in torment. When he begged for mercy, Abraham reminded him that Lazarus had lived in torment, while the rich man lived in selfish luxury. The man then asked if Lazarus could be sent to his brothers to warn them. But Abraham said if they had not heeded Moses or the prophets, they would ignore even the warning of one risen from the dead.
