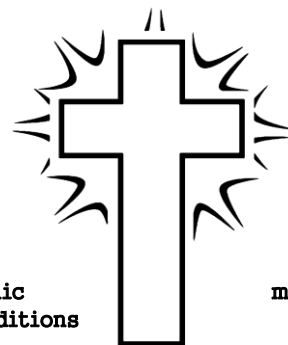

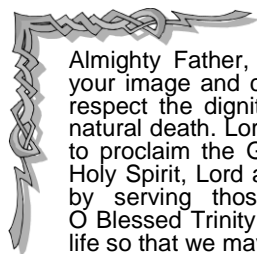

## “HEALING”

All of today's readings are connected. Our 1<sup>st</sup> reading tells of the faith of Naaman, his miraculous healing and his great gratitude to God. The gospel repeats this story when Jesus tells ten lepers to “show themselves to the Priest”. Then He heals them. Only the Samaritan returns to thank and praise God. Jesus then gives this man the gift of salvation telling him, “Your faith has saved you!” In our 2<sup>nd</sup> reading, St. Paul tells you “if we deny Him, he will deny us.” What is the connection between these readings? Reconciliation is the act of asking God, through the Priest, for healing. With humility, gratitude, and faith, we are saved. Today's leprosy is the sin of pride and ingratitude. The God that saves you is the same God who suffered for you. When will be the next time you will thank God? Will it be tonight, tomorrow or next Sunday? Our God is not just a Sunday God, but He is a moment by moment, day by day, Lord of your life type of God. The next time you want to say “Thank you Lord”, go to the healing Sacrament of Reconciliation, where he waits for your return and you are made whole! 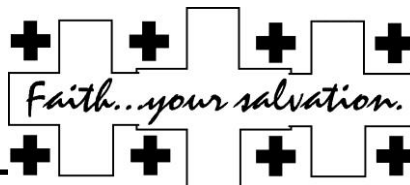

## TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### First Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17

Elisha cures Naaman of leprosy, which convinces Naaman that there is only one God. Naaman then asks to take some loads of soil from Israel, so that he can worship and make sacrifices to one true God on his own land.

### Second Reading: 2 Timothy 2:8-13

Paul reminds Timothy that Christ rose from the dead so that many people could be saved. Paul was being treated as a criminal and kept in chains but says, "There is no chaining the word of God!" Paul also says, "if we die in Christ, we will live in him. But if we deny him, he will deny us."

### Gospel: Luke 17:11-19

Jesus cures ten lepers, but only one returns to express gratitude for being healed. Jesus is disappointed that only one gave thanks to God, but tells that one, "Your faith has been your salvation."

## WALKING THE WALK

Intimidated by the prospect of walking 487.5 miles in 33 to 35 days? Fellow parishioner Joe Santiso is not. He is motivated, he trained, he prepared, and beginning September 14th, he will do it! Wearing a backpack weighing about 15 pounds, using 2 walking sticks, carrying his Credencial del Peregrino, (registered passport to be stamped at intervals along the route), Joe will embark on an adventure that he expects to be a transformative experience.

Having chosen one of the most historic pilgrimage routes to Santiago de Compostela, the Camino Francés, starting in the Basque region of north-eastern France, Joe will begin his trek in St. Jean Pied de Port at the Cathedral Our Lady - Le Puy-en-Velay.

Undaunted by challenges, the thought of which would defeat the faint of heart, he will initiate his journey by crossing the Pyrenees into Spain. Averaging 15 to 16 miles per day, interspersed with a few days of rest, he will have achieved his goal culminating in a visit to the tomb of St. James the Great. The apostle brought Christianity to the Iberian Peninsula in 44AD. Therefore in keeping with a directive from St. Jerome, the remains of St. James were transported from Rome and are now located in the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela (Galicia), which is a world heritage site. There Joe will be awarded, the beautiful document, the Compostela.

As Joe follows, not the yellow brick road, but rather the yellow arrows pointing the way to his sacred destination, we, his friends and fellow parishioners, can join him in mind, heart and spirit by praying that he meets with success in his physical and spiritual quest.

If you would like to know more about this pilgrimage dating back to the early Middle Ages, check out either the fictional voyage portrayed by Martin Sheen, "The Way" 2011, or the documentary "Walking the Camino: Six Ways to Santiago" 2013.
