“GOOD TO GO”

In today's gospel Jesus answers questions about the “end times”. When we read through all the signs we realize that the entire period from Jesus' birth until now is filled with them; these signs have been present many times in our history. So how can we know when the end time will come? Some people are consumed with stockpiling food & water, preparing a safe place, etc. Jesus himself was not privileged to know the day or the hour. Jesus warns us about believing and following fake prophets and doomsday seers. In the end of today's gospel Jesus instructs you to persevere in faith “for by your perseverance you will secure your lives.” He does not warn us to stockpile anything, nor does He advise us to know the day and time by believing in false prophecies. It is only for God to know the end time. It is enough for us to live by God's standards and to be firm in keeping His commandments, beatitudes, church precepts and by receiving the sacraments. Let go of your fear and trust in God's mercy and love. Fight the good fight all the way to the end and you will be “good to go” and ready to meet and greet your Lord Jesus Christ. **Join RCIA on Thursday evening, 7pm in the parish house. THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Malachi 3:19-20a

The prophet Malachi warned that the time would come when all the evil people would be punished. He then speaks of the arrival of “the sun of justice, with its healing rays,” believed by most to mean Jesus.

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

Some of the Thessalonians claimed Christ's return was imminent, so they stopped working and asked others for food. Paul describes his willingness to work, so that he would not impose on others. He encourages them to follow his example and earn their own living.

Gospel: Luke 21:5-19

Jesus warns of the persecution all Christians will face because of him, and how some will even be put to death. Yet he says they will not be harmed because “by patient endurance you will save your lives.” If Jesus' followers are loyal, they will be resurrected and their suffering will end.
