RCIA is the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA is a process, not so much a program, as a journey of faith. It is centered on nurturing a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ and the Church He founded. The process provides interested adults and older teens the opportunity to gradually become a part of the Catholic Church, and receive the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist. **Who is RCIA for?**

1. Persons who have not been Baptized and desire to become Catholic.
2. Persons baptized in another Christian tradition who desire to become Catholic.
3. Baptized Catholics in need of 1st Communion and/or Confirmation

First Reading: 1 Kings 3:5, 7-12

Second Reading: Romans 8:28-30

Gospel: Matthew 13:44-52

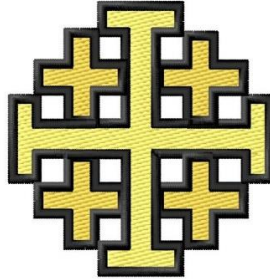
