LENT BEGINS THIS WEDNESDAY, FEB. 14TH

During the forty days of Lent there will be two daily Masses: 8:15am Monday to Saturday and 7:00pm evening Mass Monday to Friday in the Chapel. Stations of the Cross will be on Friday after Mass in the morning and evening. Confessions will be heard every Saturday at 4:00pm to 4:45pm and Monday evenings from 7:30 to 8:30pm in Church. Almsgiving, fasting and abstinence are also Lenten practices. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics and we should abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent.

“THE CURE”

In both our 1st reading and the Gospel, we are reminded of the suffering and rejection of being a leper. Today there is a cure for leprosy, but is there a cure for the leprosy of your heart and mind? Like the lepers in today's readings, do you suffer from the modern form of leprosy that eats away at your "wholeness." Are you harboring unforgiveness, or practicing negative gossip, and unfair judgements? Too bad you can't take a miracle pill that will "cure" you of these sins. In our 2nd reading, St. Paul says "do everything for the Glory of God." Do your actions and words shine with God's Glory or are they hurtful and demeaning? Christ was moved with pity for the leper in today's Gospel and "stretched out His hand, and touched him, saying he made clean," YOU TOO CAN BE MADE CLEAN. Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, where Jesus waits for you, desiring to heal you and make you whole. WILL YOU UNBURDEN YOUR HEART AND MIND ALLOWING JESUS TO SET YOU FREE? First Reading: Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46

The Lord tells Moses and Aaron that anyone bearing the sore of leprosy must first be seen by Aaron or one of the other priests, and that as long as the sore is upon him, "He shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp."

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:31—11:1

Paul instructs the Corinthians to do everything for the glory of God, to avoid offending others, and to be imitators of Christ.

Gospel: Mark 1:40-45

Jesus takes pity on a leper and cures him of his disease with a warning not to say but to show himself to the priest and make an offering. Instead of remaining silent, the leper greatly publicized the healing, making it impossible for Jesus to enter the town openly.
