THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

First Reading: Exodus 3:1-8a, 13-15

Moses came upon a burning bush, when God called out to him. God told Moses that he had seen the suffering of his people in Egypt, and intended to lead them from their captors to a land of milk and honey. Moses asked what he should say if the Israelites should ask what God wished to be called. God replied, "I am who am."

Second Reading: I Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12

Paul describes how the people were led into the desert by Moses, yet many of them were struck down by God. He warns that this should serve as an example not to give in to wicked desires or we may suffer the same downfall.

Gospel: Luke 13:1-9

Jesus says that an individual's misfortune does not mean that their sins were greater than someone else's. He warns that without repenting, all sinners will meet the same end. He tells of a barren fig tree whose owner planned to cut it down. But a servant offered to give it special care for one year, and destroy it should it remain barren. This symbolizes God's patience toward us.

"GOD'S OPPORTUNITIES"

In today's 2nd reading, St. Paul tells us that although the Corinthians all drank and ate the same spiritual food, God was not pleased with most of them. Is God pleased with you? In the gospel reading, Jesus gives us the warning, "I tell you if you do not repent you will perish, if you do not bear fruit, you will be cut down." Jesus' warning to you is simple; there may not be as much time as you think. Lent should be the season where we repent, change, straighten our brokenness, uproot whatever chokes us off from our Lord. Christ longs to cultivate "His Divine Life" in our hearts so we can bear fruit. Why not begin with a daily prayer process each night by asking several questions concerning the day? Start with "gratitude" - what are you grateful for today? Then "awareness" - when were you at your best? Follow this with "significant moments" - did God speak with you or show you something, maybe through another person or situation? Then "peace" - ask God to forgive you for a wrong and help you to do better tomorrow, ask Him for the courage to change. Finally "pray for others" - who do you want God to bless in your life? When we look at each day with the eyes of "God's Opportunities" we can see where we succeed and where we are weak. We call God into our day, into our life process. When we cultivate a life with Christ we will blossom and produce much fruit. Want to know more? RCIA meets Thursdays at 7pm at the parish house. For more information call Msgr.
