"THE OFFER"

Today we celebrate the 4th Sunday of Easter, sometimes called "Shepherd Sunday". Today's readings make us an "offer" we should not refuse, though many do. The questions to ask yourself are: "Do I really want this kind of love, security and joy that Jesus offers? And, Do I want or need a shepherd? Jesus Christ, who calls Himself the "Good Shepherd" laid down his life for you. He tells you that His flock hears and knows His voice for you.
