

"ANAMNESIS"

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the true Body and Blood of Jesus Christ: The Eucharist. This holy Sacrament is the source and summit of our Catholic faith. Catholics believe that at every Mass the ordinary bread and wine, when consecrated, becomes the true body, blood, soul and divinity made present to every believer. Holy Communion unites you to Christ. In today's gospel we see Jesus giving us a preview of the Eucharist when He provides the miracle of the fish and loaves. He fills the hungry when they cannot provide for themselves. Every human heart hungers for truth. Jesus is Truth and only he can fill the hungry heart. Shortly after Jesus' death and resurrection, the early Christians and Apostles, according to John, met on Sunday for the breaking of the bread (Acts 2, 20). "The faithful receive the bread of heaven, the cup of salvation and the Body of Christ, who offered Himself up for the life of the world" (Jn 6:51). We can see that from the beginning all Christians believed that the Eucharist was and still is the true presence of Jesus Christ. In the original early scripture writings we find the Greek word "anamnesis" which is translated as "to make alive and present again". Today we use the word "memorial" in the Eucharistic prayer and also "do this in memory of me". However, we are not recalling something from the past but actually we recognize the action as being alive and continued in the present. The church recognizes that the sacrifice of Christ is made "present and real" during the consecration at every Mass. Just like today's gospel during the consecration at every Mass. Just like today's gosper miracle Jesus continues to feed you, love you and longs for you, His faithful believers. Do you believe? Jesus told you "This is my body, this is my blood given up for you; unless you eat my body and drink my blood, you will not have life in you." Receive the words of your Savior, in faith, for since He is all truth and cannot lie, why do you doubt? Let your heart be a living tabernacle for the living Christ and believe! THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST

First Reading: Genesis 14:18-20

Melchizedek, a priest of God, prayed that Abram would be blessed by God. He also praised God for delivering Abram's foes into his hands.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

Paul describes Jesus' actions during the last supper. Jesus broke bread and said it was his body given for us, asking that we do the same in remembrance of him. He then passed the cup and called it his blood. Jesus then asked us to break bread in this manner to remember his death until he returns.

Gospel: Luke 9:11b-17

Jesus spoke to a large crowd when his disciples asked that he dismiss the people to give them a chance to find food and lodging. Jesus asked the disciples to give the crowd something to eat, but they had only five loaves of bread and two fish. Jesus then blessed and distributed the food, which fed about 5,000 people. Twelve baskets were then collected from what was left over.
