"ARE YOU GOD'S STEWARD?"

Do you own your possessions or do they own you? How devastated would you be should you lose all your material wealth? These are two great questions for you to reflect upon during the coming week. Today's gospel parable speaks of a steward who is confronted with the reality that he is about to lose his livelihood and must give an account of what he has done. Reflecting on his situation, he decides to show kindness by allowing his neighbors to pay only half of what they owe his boss, thereby winning over their friendship. He is a poor model of repentance; he is driven by purely selfish motives. As a last ditch effort he tries to redeem himself. Are you like the steward, waiting until the last moment to seek friendship with our Lord by beauting kindness morey foreiveness and above all obsertly to waiting until the last moment to seek mendship with our Lord by showing kindness, mercy, forgiveness and above all charity to others? All you have has been given to you by God. Your intelligence, your strength, your abilities, your advantages, and your foresight – all gifts. Your success is allowed by the Lord in order for you to serve others. It is your opportunity to put your love for God into action. Jesus tells us today, "You cannot cannot both God and mammen for you will be devoted to one serve both God and mammon, for you will be devoted to one and despise the other." Who are you devoted to? Who do you serve? Jesus also tells us "The person who is not trustworthy in very small matters cannot be trusted with great ones." are faithless with earthly riches then how can you be entrusted with heaven. Don't wait to choose until you are under judgment, like the steward, for you may be "a dollar short and a day late." Decide now. Pray for right judgment and a generous heart. First Reading: Amos 8:4-7
The prophet Amos expressed disgust over people who take advantage of the poor. He describes businessmen scheming to cheat the poor, then declares that God will "never forget the things they have done."

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 2:1-8
Paul urges the Christians to pray for all people, especially those in authority. Paul even asked them to pray for the kings who denounced Christ's teachings, because God wants all people to be saved through Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 16:1-13

Jesus tells a story about a servant who tries to cheat his employer. The owner is impressed because he would do the same thing himself. Jesus then describes the importance of being trustworthy in small matters, as well as in greater ones. He then states that no one can serve two masters faithfully, so people cannot give themselves completely to both God and money.
