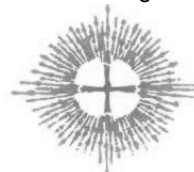

“WHAT ARE YOU WAITING FOR?”

In the Old Testament we find the Prophet Jeremiah announcing a hopeful prophecy, when He declares, “I will send many fishermen says the Lord, to restore the Israelites from their exile.” (Jer. 16:14-16). In today’s gospel, Jesus fulfills Jeremiah’s prophecy when He calls Simon, Andrew, James and John to follow him; “Come after me and I will make you Fishers of Men.” Jesus’s plan is set in motion with today’s gospel when He declares “The Kingdom of God is at hand, Repent and Believe in the Gospel.” Jesus does not tell you to believe in the NY times, The Wall Street Journal or the Stock Market, but He tells you “Believe in the Gospel.” All three of today’s readings speak to you about rejecting the evil ways of the world and focusing on the importance of Repentance in bringing about God’s Compassion and Mercy. Only personal conversion, which is a lifelong turning towards God, along with an understanding that the Kingdom of God begins in the Here and Now, will pave your way to Heaven. You must choose the way of Holiness, the way of the “Good News”, the way of Our Lord. What are you clinging to? THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Jonah 3:1-5, 10

Jonah set out for Nineveh as God asked and told the people that their city would be destroyed in forty days. The people believed him and repented from their evil ways. God did not destroy their city, showing his mercy for those who see the evil of their ways and correct it.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:29-31

Paul advises the Corinthians that their world is changing, so they should not take their daily trials too seriously. We should remember that the problems of everyday living will not last forever, but the eternal life God promises us will.

Gospel: Mark 1:14-20

Jesus observes Simon and Andrew where they are fishing and tells them to come with him and become “fishers of men.” They abandon their nets without hesitation to follow him. Next he calls James and his brother John, who also leave what they are doing and follow him without question.

PRO-LIFE CORNER

I continue from last week regarding "love versus want." Every child should be a loved child. The child who is loved will not be a burden, because love is stronger than any burden. Wanted carries the implication of being "for-me." I want someone to cut my grass, and paint my deck. But when the grass is cut, and the deck is painted, the "want" no longer exists. Two people marry each other because they "want" each other. The husband may want a cook or a housekeeper; the wife may want a provider, or a protector. But if the love is not present, is not sincere, the marriage is most fragile. Divorce is a way of discarding a marriage because "wantedness" has run its course. Being loved, therefore, would have saved the marriage from the perilous state of merely being wanted. Love endures; want is momentary.

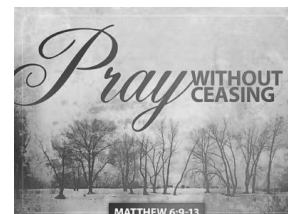
