



The Risingville Intercommunity Service Effort (RISE) repairs homes for those whose living conditions are unsatisfactory and who cannot help themselves, due to physical and/or economic inability. Work teams are comprised of 5-6 high school youth and 2 adults. Teams fund raise throughout the year to be able to provide for their transportation to and from the worksite, building materials, and meals. During the RISE week, the teams are housed in centers, usually schools or churches, sleeping on floors, showering in nearby facilities (campgrounds, YMCA...) and learning to live, work, and share in community.
